## **ABOUT THIS PROJECT**

LOCATION

Toronto, ON

Created as a memorial to honour Dr. George Grasett and his Canadian colleagues for the sacrifices made when accommodating Irish famine victims and refugees in the summer of 1847.

Illuminated the custom made structural glass panels with printed cloth patterns (representative of tent-like fever sheds), with LED technology to glow at night time.

- + Used 4000 Kelvin to minimize the green hue of iron in the tempered glass, and bring forth natural tones in the sky.
- project process, creating a monument that is cohesive throughout. Balanced the weight of five sheets of compressed glass with the delicate
- infrastructure underneath. Many arrangements were considered and multiple lighting tests were conducted
- prior to the final installation.
- The base of the park acts as a map, displaying the city's harbour during the time of their arrival into Toronto.
- A photo sensor turns on the lights until 11 PM each night, when it turns off to avoid night sky pollution.
