ABOUT THIS PROJECT

+ Construction of new building to provide office and community spaces for the Tla'amin Nation on the Sunshine Coast of British Columbia.

- + One of the Pacific Northwest's indigenous Coast Salish tribes, the Tla'amin Nation has a rich history in the area, moving into a self-governing treaty in 2016.
- + The project addressed the need for municipal office spaces, as well as community areas like an art gallery, and recreation and gathering spaces.
- Mechanically, the HVAC and fire protection systems were designed to blend seamlessly into the high wood-panelled ceilings to retain the open feeling of the space.
- Due to the various functions the building serves, electrical systems like security and lighting control were carefully designed to suit the individual needs of each space.
- + For energy efficiency, LED lighting was used throughout the building.
